### **Didactic Program Overview**

This program is designed for medical providers interested in providing forensic-medical assessment and care to victims of sexual assault. The 40 hr. course, conducted over a 4 (10 hr.) or 5 (8 hr.) day period, is designed to provide Registered Nurses, MDs and PAs with a comprehensive education program consisting of:

- Assessment
- Examination
- Collection of forensic evidence
- Evaluation of sexual assault victims
